Mark 13:26-33

²⁶ Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory. ²⁷ Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. ²⁸ "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and



puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. ²⁹ So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he^[a] is near, at the very gates. ³⁰ Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. ³¹ Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." ³² "But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ³³ Beware, keep alert;^[b] for you do not know when the time will come."

Keep Awake!

I have a vague recollection of being a small child, trying with all my power to stay awake on Christmas Eve, wanting more than anything to hear or even see Santa Clause. I suspect I never lasted very long but fell deeply asleep after a short while. I suspect children today still try to do this on Christmas Eve.

The season of Advent is upon us. The church has been decorated or it's at least mostly decorated. Some of us have started Christmas shopping and arranging for family visits. Most of us are already deeply immersed in the busy-ness that preparing for Christmas requires.

We know that these days of Advent are meant to allow us to wait patiently for the birth of the child, Jesus. We'll once again remember and celebrate his birthday. Staying awake to the real meaning of this day we celebrate, December 25th, isn't easy. There are so many distractions during the weeks before us.

So much about Christmas has become secular. Many people love this holiday, as we who are involved Christians do. But for many, the meaning is simply a time to buy gifts for family members and close friends. Certainly, this is a nice thing to do. But then, Christmas becomes a strange and self-serving holiday. The part about celebrating the birth of Messiah has gotten lost somehow for so many of us. Yet Jesus' birth is the finest gift we receive.

And truth be told, even we who are faithful forget, for all of the distractions. Even we get lost in the tangle of consumerism. "What do you want for Christmas?" we ask. We may not remember that the most important gift is already given to each and every one of us. That gift is the promise of new life in Christ available to us even as we live life.

When we keep awake and remind ourselves often that we belong to Christ; that we live our lives to help other people come to know Christ, we receive the gift of Christmas each and every day of our lives. There is no other gift that can compare.

Take time in the midst of your preparations. Be with God and contemplate how marvelous this season is, and how blessed we are to live faithful lives in a world that presents difficult challenges.

Take time to think about the baby Jesus' story. And keep awake! He'll be here soon.




