


Some thoughts from Pastor Alana

August, 2020



13 That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea.²Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow.⁴And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. ⁵Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil.⁶But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹Let anyone with ears listen!"

Matthew 13:1-9

We recently read these verses in worship. The images that come to us as we read are images we can easily relate to, and the message in these verses raises some questions:

Is God reckless with the way God scatters seed?

Is God suggesting that we don't need to play it safe when it comes to sharing our faith?

You know I'm fond of saying that God is always with us. Yet we have a difficult time remembering this. I know it is so, because I myself need reminding of this. We forget this when difficulties arise in life. Fight or flight easily kicks in when we're told we need to wear masks because of a pandemic. (Prayers that this is a once in a life-time event and that it will run its course, as long as we carefully follow prescribed mitigation procedures).

Not only does God scatter seed. God wants us to scatter seed, and to do this with abandon, understanding that some of the seed won't grow but some of them will. We're invited to share the Good News, about our beliefs, about the church, about the good deeds done by people who are nurtured by the church; by their faith.

God wants us to scatter seeds, even during a global pandemic. We can do this in many ways. YOU have been doing this in many ways. You've been making sure there's food in our Little Food Pantry. Some of you have baked treats to gift to the essential workers at Mallard's Landing. Some of you have been sending cards and making phone calls to members and friends who are homebound (as we all more or less are for a while.) You came out to celebrate Makayla Malcolm's graduation. You pray for those who need to prayers. You have been casting seeds far and wide, even unawares.

I feel very blessed to be pastor to such a compassionate community. This church exerts so much energy helping other people to grow by letting your faith show clearly. You are constantly scattering seeds. It is a gift and a blessing that there is so much care, and that it is shared in the church and in the community in many different ways.

Sometimes, according to Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Johnson, "we play it safe, sowing the word only where we are confident it will be well received, and only where those who receive it are likely to become contributing members of our congregations. we hold tightly to our resources (our time, talents and treasure), wanting to make sure that nothing is wasted. Jesus' approach to mission is quite at odds with our play-it-safe instincts."¹

May we continue our brave and generous scattering of seed as we help people who need Christ in their lives, see Christ in us.

Workers: September is our month to staff the Ecumenical Food Pantry. We expect to need workers for **Tuesday and Thursday** evenings from 4:00-7:00 PM. If you are able to volunteer for one or more evenings, please call me, Micki Baden, at 586-457-0457 or email micki.baden@gmail.com. The maximum number of workers needed each evening is four. Food will be distributed using the curbside pickup technique to eliminate as much contact as possible.



Donations:

There will not be a food drive this year. The Ecumenical Food Pantry managers (St Vincent de Paul) are requesting only donations of money. If you are able to give, please write your check to First Congregational Church and mark it for the Ecumenical Food Pantry. Cash is acceptable too, you can put it in an envelope so marked. We will make sure you get credit and take care of sending the money on to the pantry.

If you don't know how the Ecumenical Food Pantry operates:



The Ecumenical Food Pantry is supported by eight local churches and serves clients in the city of St. Clair and the townships of St. Clair, China, and East China. The pantry is located on Orchard Street near 9th St., across from St. Mary's School. The Pantry is open Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Clients call ahead and are assigned a time to arrive at the Pantry, beginning at 5:00 PM and scheduled every 10 minutes, until 7:00 pm. The normal procedures will be altered but should follow this general process:

- Around 3:45 pm, the Team Leader arrives at the pantry with a list showing how many clients we will be serving that evening.
- At 4:00 pm, our church's volunteers arrive.
- Between 4:00 and 5:00 PM we pack bags with a week's worth of food for each family on the list; the amount packed depends on the size of the family.
- At 5:00 PM the first family will arrive to pick up their food and may receive soap, toilet paper, etc. if they need it.
- Clients arrive every 10 minutes until the last one has been served, but no later than 7:00 PM. (Depending on the number of clients, we sometimes finish early.)

To volunteer to staff the pantry in September, please call me or email me.

DOCUMENT CHANGES – JULY 2020

BY-LAWS: Article I, Paragraph 3 was added; (Open and Affirming Inclusive Church Covenant)

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE BARBARA WESTON MOORE FUND AND THE ENDOWMENT FUND OF THE FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH, U.C.C. ST CLAIR, MICHIGAN:

Purpose of the Fund:

4. To support Mission and Outreach programs, we would tithe quarterly 10% of the Fund to be distributed to Mission.

Purpose of the Fund:

4. To support Mission and Outreach programs as prescribed in the Distribution of Funds.

Distribution of the Fund:

Paragraph 3. would be added to read –

3. 10% of the quarterly distribution shall be tithed to Mission.

Current Paragraph 3. would become 4.; Current Paragraph 4. would become 5.; Current Paragraph 5. would become 6.

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE ENDOWMENT FUND
