Barb Fandrick and I would like to thank each and every one of you who contributed in helping us with the Ecumenical Food Pantry for the month of September. Because of the generous donations of funds and food donations, we were able to supply the pantry with 435 pounds of food! We kept the refrigerator stocked with eggs and milk and freezer with hot dogs. We have an additional \$434.56 that we will send to the pantry to purchase food as needed.

In September, we served 83 families with a total of 189 people and packed approximately 3,029 pounds of food and non food items.
